
Stinsford Parish Council Climate and Ecological Emergency Strategy Delivery Plan

1. Delivery actions

- 1.1 This is Stinsford Parish Council (SPC)'s delivery plan action list. It is divided into short (1-year), medium (2.5 years) and long term (5-year +) actions. This is a working document. It should be read in conjunction with Stinsford Parish Council Climate and Ecological Emergency Strategy.
- 1.2 Once the working group is established, the objectives will be reviewed and amended with all changes being subject to the agreement of the Parish Council. The Parish Council will review progress and identify further opportunities for action every 6 months.
